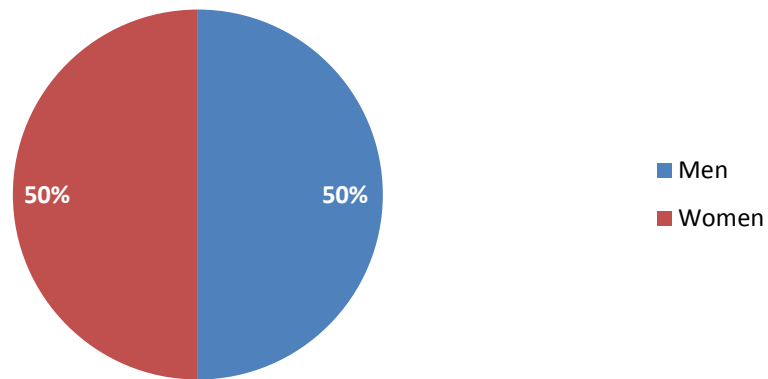


SEEDs among NEETS – Malta

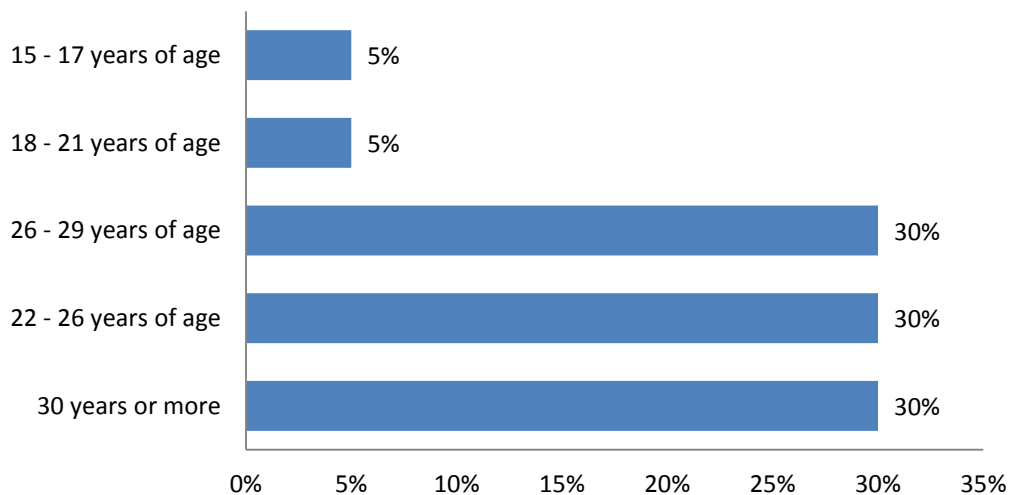
**ANALYSIS - Charts**

**Gender:** (n = 20)

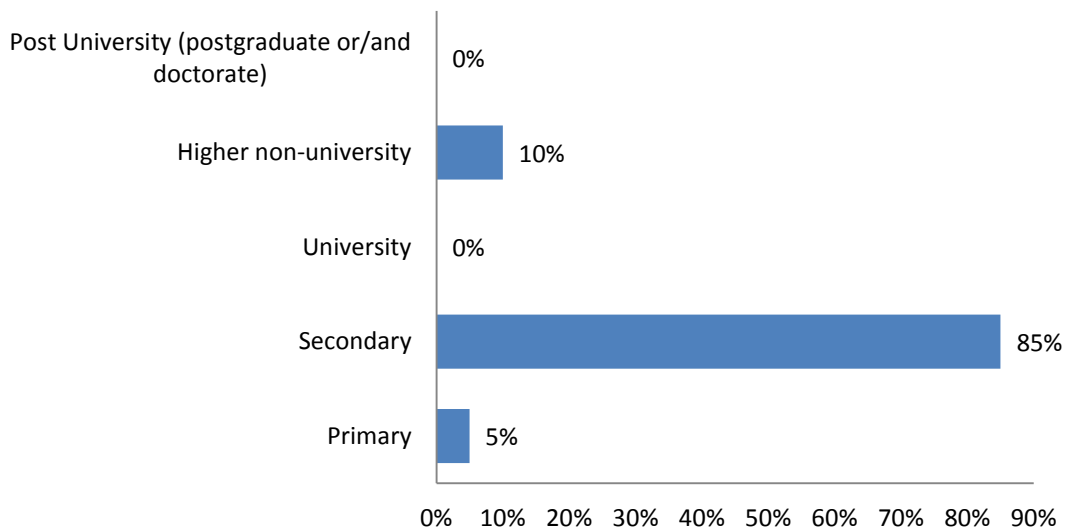


**In which age group do you belong?** (n = 20)



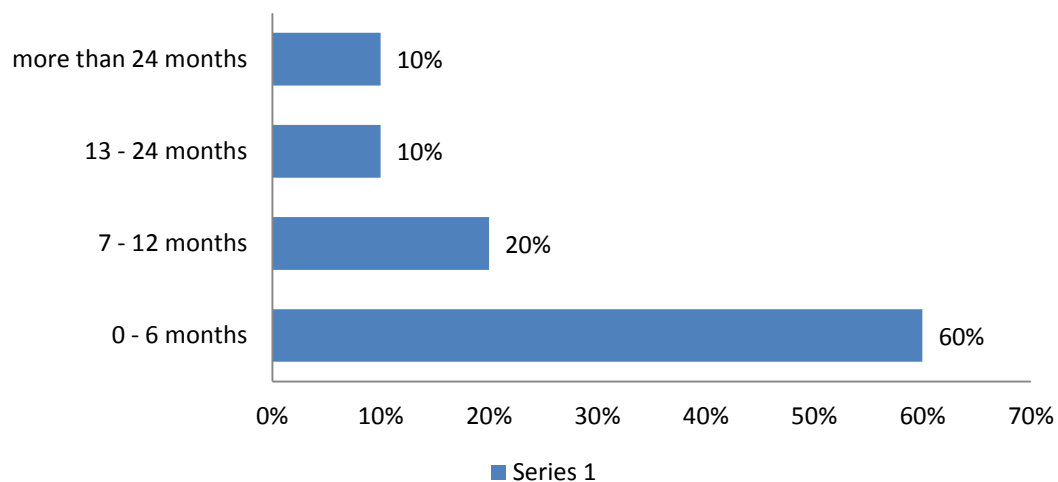
90% of NEETS staff are over the 26 year bracket and in the bracket 30 years or more all respondents are under 50 years of age.

**What is your highest level of formal education?** (n = 50)



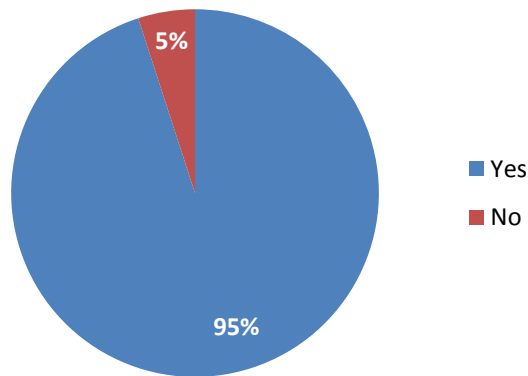
As can be seen the highest percentage 85% are with secondary level of education since the introduction of NEETS is a relatively new subject in Malta and many are still not used to or understand the role of this profession.

Most ie 60% work in this field for 6 months, prior to going for university studies or finding a full time job, the main reason is that all NEETS programs are funded related so workers prefer a more long ten employment.

**Are you registered in the public employment services?** (n = 20)

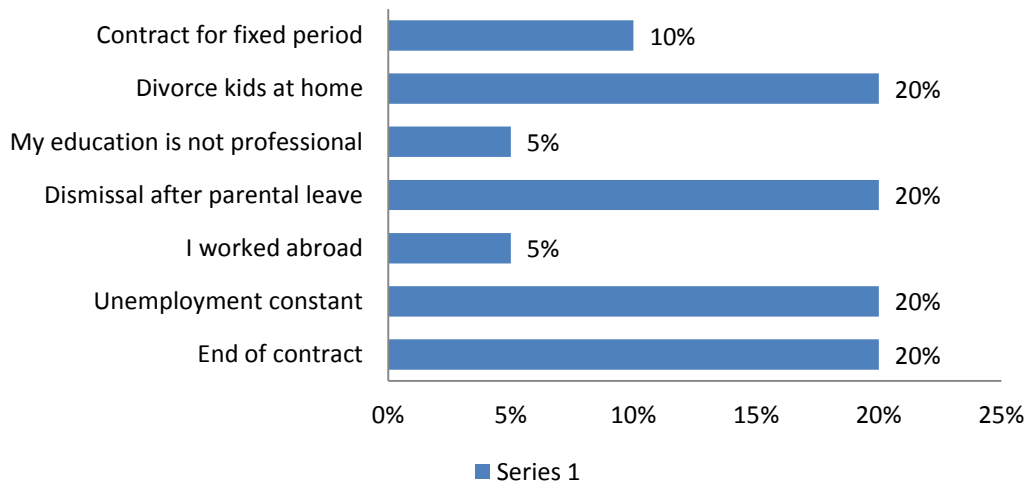


**If you answered NO on previous question, why aren't you registered in the public employment services?**

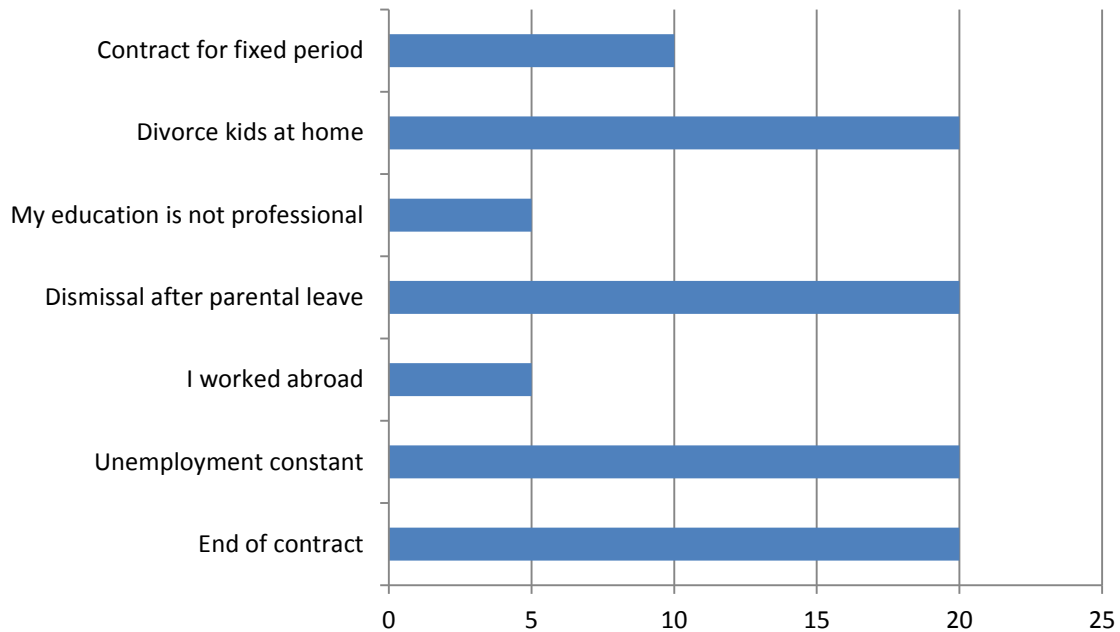
**What are the main reasons you are not in employment?** (n = 20)

Multiple answers are possible

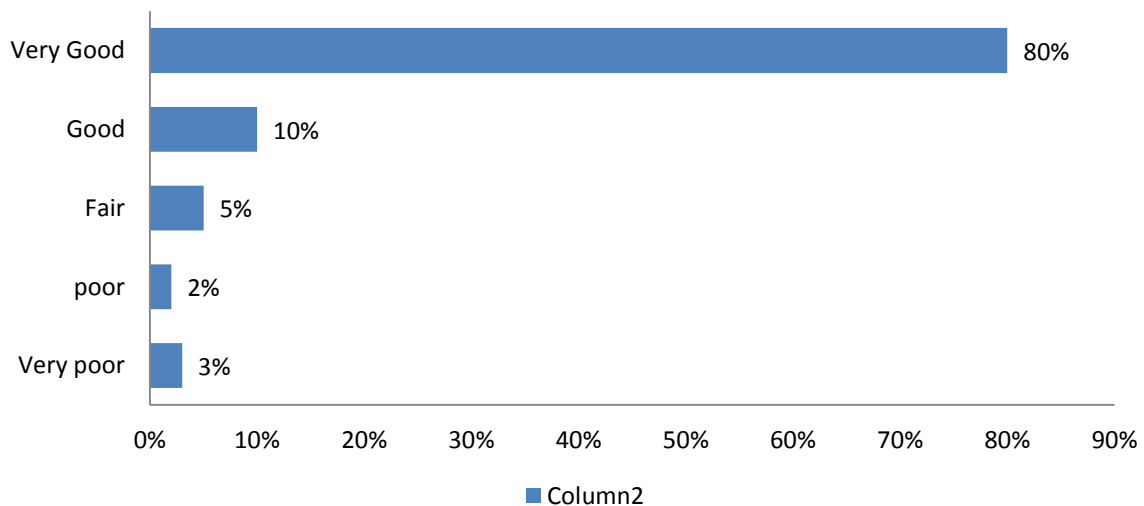

**Please describe what is the background of the reason/s that you have ticked in previous question**



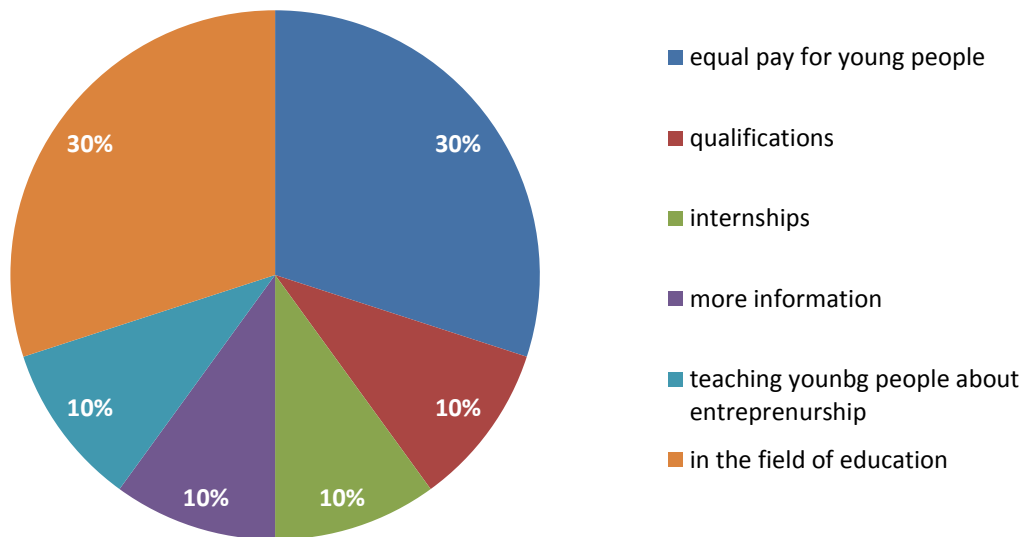
**How would you rate the level of support provided to unemployed youth by the national public employment services of your country? (n = 20)**

**What are the main obstacles that you face when trying to find a job?** (n = 20)

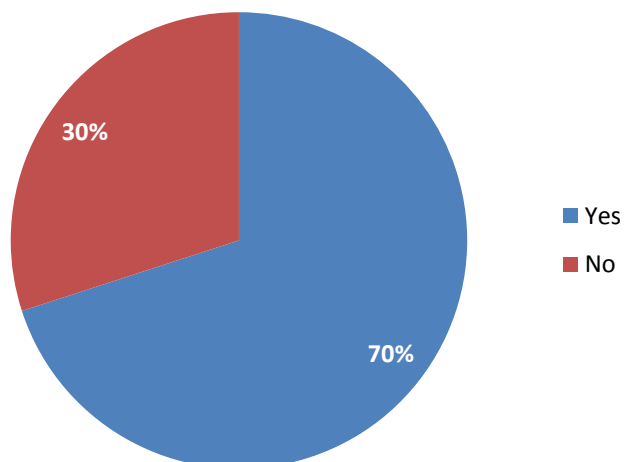

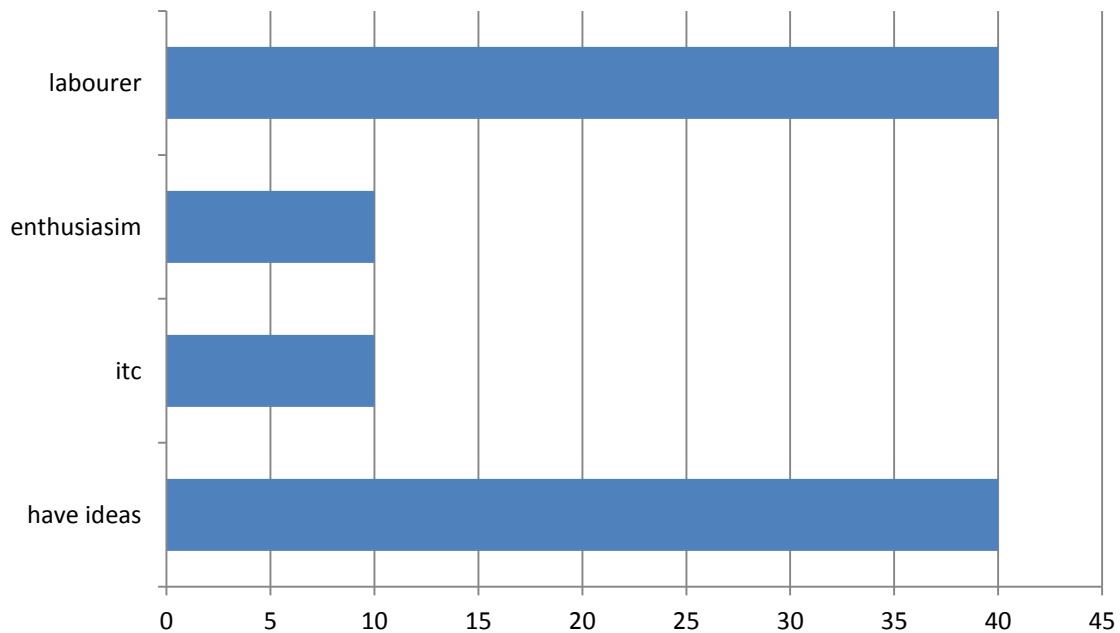
**What measures could be taken by both the state and other actors to reduce youth unemployment?

**Do you know your competences?** (n = 20)



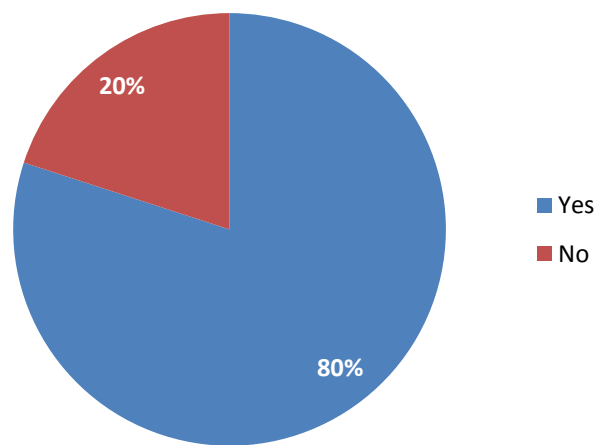

Most of the respondents see below 40% prefer unskilled work, whilst the same 40% state that they have ideas, however considering that Malta has moved from low skilled factory workers to more technical educated factory workers, a category of workers with only basic studies are finding it difficult to find employment and although unskilled or uneducated their expectations and wage requirements do not fit with their skills.
